Our annualized savings just in our management fees will be more than \$42,000. This decision along with that of seeking another lawn care service has already set a different tone within our community. However, self management does come at a cost.


Thus far, your seven member board of directors have assumed these added responsibilities. Each of us takes a turn in responding to your calls and emails, and all of us meet more often to support one another in the decision making process and the business of the association. We will continue to work to meet your demands, but we ask your patience and understanding if we are not always able to respond in the time frame that you desire. Remember, we are all volunteers and carry these responsibilities in addition to that of being wage earners, parents and spouses.

On another note, you will be hearing more from your board of directors in the next few months about the importance of deed restrictions, their enforcement and an increased focus on collecting delinquent dues/fees. As you can imagine, none of us on the board of directors looks forward to having to address any of these topics. *However, as we have met with certain officials, we have now come to the conclusion that we have no other alternative since this directly affects our property value and the ability of prospective buyers to secure loans.*

Each resident will be receiving a letter within the near future to invite you to a special meeting to discuss these concerns further. I encourage each of you to attend these meetings to learn more about the importance of following the deed restrictions and the urgency that we now have in collecting delinquent fees. Further, I implore each of you to do a self review of your property and your compliance with the deed restrictions as well as your status with regard to your association dues/fees. It is more advantageous for each of us to correct any areas of concern rather than the association.



Breezy Summer Recipes

RECIPES FOR THE SEASON from the kitchen of Susan Nicholson

Peanut Butter & Apple Pizza

1 pkg 18 oz sugar cookie dough
 1 pkg 8 oz cream cheese
 ½ c brown sugar – firmly packed
 ¼ c creamy peanut butter
 ½ tsp vanilla
 2 medium granny smith apples
 1 tsp cinnamon
 ¼ c carmel topping
 ¼ c hot fudge topping

Preheat oven to 350°

1/2 c chopped peanuts

CRUST – spray pan with Pam. Shape cookie dough into a ball. Slice dough into ¼ inch slices and place on pan, use a roller to roll edges together to form one giant cookie. Bake 16 – 18 minutes or until light golden brown. Cool 10 minutes and carefully loosen cookie from baking pan edges.

TOPPING – Combine cream cheese, brown sugar, peanut butter and vanilla in a 1 qt mixing bowl. Mix well, spread mixture evenly over top of cookie. Peel and core apples, slice thin, place apples slices evenly over the peanut butter mixture. Sprinkle with cinnamon, micro wave carmel topping 30 to 45 seconds and drizzle over apples. Repeat this step for the hot fudge. Chop peanuts and sprinkle over apples. Cut with a pizza cutter. (fun to use a pizza pan but easier to cut in a small cookie sheet)

Strawberry Salad

½ or 1 qt fresh Strawberries – rinsed and sliced
1 lb fresh Spinach
Dressing ingredients

½ c sugar
2 Tbs sesame seeds
1Tbs poppy seeds
¼ tsp Worcestershire sauce
½ c cooking oil
¼ c cider vinegar

Mix in blender all dressing ingredients except the poppy and sesame seeds. Mixture will be slightly thick. Stir in seeds. Mix with Spinach & Strawberries to taste just before serving.
